Ephesians 2:1-7

INTRODUCTION: OUR UNION WITH CHRIST

- 1. Our union with Christ is real and vital. John 15:5
- 2. Our union with Christ begins not when we die and go to heaven, but when we are born again. Rom 6:1-15
- 3. The great value of being united with Christ is Christ Himself. Philippians 1:21, 23
- \rightarrow You cannot obtain the Gift apart from obtaining the Giver.
- \rightarrow "by grace you have been saved" v.5, 8 Grace = the completely undeserved loving commitment of God to us.
- Perfect Tense = completed action in the past with continuing results in the present

UNITED WITH HIM BY GRACE. v.5-6

1. By grace God made us alive together with Christ. v.5

- Before salvation = dead to Christ & "living" to sin, the world, the devil, the flesh
- After salvation = dead to sin (incl. the world, the devil, and the flesh) & alive with Christ
- The reversal of sin in our life: Compare Psalm 1:1 and Ephesians 2:1-10

2. By grace God raised us up with him. v.6a

- Paul is speaking about our co-resurrection with Christ. Not referring (here) to our physical resurrection after our body dies, but our spiritual resurrection after being made alive with Christ.
- If you are born again, you are raised up right now with Jesus. Not figuratively but really.
- Not raised up alone... but WITH Him.

3. By grace God seated us with him in the heavenly places. v.6b

- Paul is speaking of our new position and status because of salvation.
- We are now citizens of heaven. Philippians 3:20. The church is a colony of heaven.
- Our identity is so important to how we see ourselves and how we live.
- \rightarrow We should feel like we no longer fit in this world. This means something is right, not wrong, with you.

THE IMMEASURABLE RICHES OF HIS GRACE. v.7

1. God accomplished salvation for us to demonstrate the riches of His Grace.

- ...so that he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.
- The focus and intent of salvation is to bring attention to God—not to us.
 to the <u>riches</u> of God's grace.
 - -to the *immeasurable* riches of God's grace.

2. By definition, salvation by grace means that mankind contributes nothing to our salvation.

 \rightarrow So far man has had no part in this work of new life. Salvation has been accomplished—with no help from man.
