Caught in the Act X's 3

John 7:53-8:11

TRYING TO CATCH JESUS

- → This was ultimately a plan by the Pharisees to trap Jesus.
- 1. Larger context of John 7: The Pharisees were trying to catch, arrest, and kill Jesus. 7:1, 32, 45-52
 - Note Nicodemus reappears in the story... Ref. John 3: You must be born again.
- 2. The Pharisees were using this situation to 'test' Jesus so they could accuse him. John 8:6
- 3. In order to catch Jesus, they had to devise a 'gotcha plan.'

THE WOMAN CAUGHT IN THE ACT

- → The text indicates this was an intentional "sting" operation to catch the woman in adultery.
- 1. The word "caught" in v.3 & 4 includes the idea of hostile intent; I.e., trying to catch someone.
- 2. Adultery is forbidden in the 10 Commandments. Exodus 20:14: You shall not commit adultery.
 - According to Levitical Law, adultery was punishable by death.
 - Leviticus 20:10: If a man commits adultery with the wife of his neighbor, both the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death.
- 3. Under Jewish law as practiced by rabbis at the time of Christ... adultery had to be proven.
 - Observe the actual act WHILE it was happening with MULTIPLE witnesses
- → I.e., In this situation, it would be almost impossible unless it was a set up.

THE PHARISEES CAUGHT IN THE ACT

- 1. In order to trap Jesus, the Pharisees set up a trap for this woman.
- 2. Where is the man involved in this situation? Curiously absent.
- 3. This was a set-up by the Pharisees to accomplish their own agenda at the expense of a woman.
- → This was evil.
 - The real evil and sin in this situation is in the people willing to potentially sacrifice this woman's life to accomplish their own agenda.
 - Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground...
